
THE DOMESTIC EXPORTS IN JANUARY 2022

In January 2022 the exports of Georgia (excluding non-declared exports) equaled USD 331.3 million, 47.6 percent higher year-on-year. Share of the domestic exports in total export constituted 69.9 percent and amounted to USD 231.5 million, 39.1 percent higher to the same period of 2021.

TREND OF THE EXPORTS IN GEORGIA IN JANUARY 2017-2022



In January 2022 the share of the top ten trading partners by domestic exports in the total domestic exports of Georgia amounted to 84.9 percent. The top partners were Bulgaria (USD 49.5 million), Russia (USD 35.0 million) and Turkey (USD 26.2 million).

In January 2022 copper ores and concentrates reclaimed the first place in the list of top export items, equaling USD 66.3 million, or 28.7 percent of total exports. The exports of ferro-alloys totaled USD 31.4 million and their share in the total exports amounted to 13.6 percent. The exports of nitrogenous fertilizers occupied the third place standing at USD 17.6 million and constituting 7.6 percent of the total exports.

- 1. The discrepancy between the totals and the sum in some cases can be explained by using rounded data;
- 2. Information does not cover the data of Simplified Customs Declarations (Form №4);
- 3. Information does not cover non-organized trade, also occupied territories of Abkhazian Autonomous Republic and Tskhinvali region;
- 4. According to the international methodology, there are some differences in coverage of trade flows between external merchandise trade statistics and customs statistics. Diplomatic, temporary, transit and analogous goods are excluded from the database of external merchandise trade statistics.

The preliminary data will be revised according to the Geostat's revision policy (based on the regular revision principle) as a result of adjusting data by respondents/administrative sources.

Domestic exports include export of goods produced in the country, as well as imported from abroad, the value of which has significantly changed as a result of domestic processing.
