INDICATORS OF VOCATIONAL EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS (2023)


By the end of 2023, 96 educational institutions (54 public and 42 private) were in Georgia that conducted admission of students in vocational education programs.

In 2023, 15.5 thousand students were admitted, 47.9 % of whom are women and 52.1% men. Compared to 2022, student admissions have increased by 9.9 %.

The chart below presents the number of admitted students by vocational education programs in 2023.


As for the data by regions, Tbilisi has the leading position with the number of admitted students (38.1%), followed by Adjara (17.2%), Imereti (10.4%), Samegrelo-Zemo Svaneti (9.7%), Kakheti (4.8%), Kvemo Kartli (7.8%).

In 2023, 264 students were admitted with special educational needs, 35.2 % of whom are women and 64.8% men. As for the data by regions, Tbilisi has the leading position with the number of admitted students (42.4%), and next is Kvemo Kartli (10.2%).

The chart below presents the number of admitted students with special educational needs by regions in 2023.

WITH SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS BY REGIONS, 2023**





In 2023, the number of graduates was 8.1 thousand, out of which 48.3 % were women and 51.7 % - men. Most of them come from Engineering, Manufacturing, Construction (26.4%) programs, Services (19.2%), Business, Administration and Law (13.1%) programs.
